I was interested in the mention of the Austin, Texas project, having participated in its planning. The demonstrations themselves did not start until the day after I/left town. The local newspapers played up this fact a little bit.

I hope that the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, in addition to encouraging groups to work on these projects, will provide them with minimum disciplines, some advice as to the best ways and spirit in which to go about these things. I am sure you are doing this, however.
