The I.C.F. ~~was~~ at T.S.C.C. - a welcome to Tougaloo was given, and the meeting was opened with prayer.

Dr. Victor M. Rowe, (sp.?) history prof. at Tougaloo gave a very interesting and informative talk on "The Current East West Struggle and the Students' Role in I.C.F." He gave a background for the topic and defined the "East" as the Communist bloc and the "West" as the free nations under U.S. influence. He listed the following causes for the struggle: (1) Balance of power; (2) Traditional cultural and heritage differences; (3) Economic contexts and supremacy; and (4) Ideological. He also stated that narrow concepts of patriotism are no longer right, as citizens we should want our country to do what is right and good without hurting other parts of the world. As students and citizens we should identify these things and then act in accordance with our consciences. A discussion followed the talk.

The business session was opened and presided over by C.B. Sawyer. The question of where to keep the funds of the I.C.F. was discussed and it was decided that the Sec. should handle the money as he sees fit. Eddie King, Council of Human Relations, and Dr. Borinski gave reports on that meeting.
